Work placement

- We recommend completing 100 hours of workplacebased training (work placement) to gain practical skills.
- You, your parent/guardian and VET Coordinator are ultimately responsible for finding and securing your work placement position.
- Choose a workplace according to your location, availability, and interests.
- Ideal facilities include kennels, catteries, doggy daycares, shelters, pet shops (with access to animals), wildlife centres, zoos, and vet practices.
- You will need to have access to at least two species of animals.
- Current employment/volunteering in animal care may qualify as a work placement
- Your work placement will be subject to review and approval.

What to expect?

Environmental Requirements

In your workplace, you may need to:

- Work outdoors, exposed to various weather conditions.
- Encounter moderate levels of noise, including animal sounds and/or the general public.
- Be physically capable of lifting equipment, and standing or walking for extended periods.

Assessment Types

Students will be assessed on their skills and knowledge in various ways, including:

 Written answers, online assessments and tests, multiple choice questions and practical demonstrations via video or photographic submissions.

Entry requirements

The great news is, there are no prerequisites for this course however you will need to:

- Have a reliable internet connection and laptop.
- Be proficient in speaking and writing in English.
- Be physically capable of restraining animals, handling animal feed e.g. large bags of food of up to 10kg and standing for extended periods of time.
- Have a minimum level of schooling up to and including year 10, with a good understanding of science and maths.
- Be at least Year 10 high school age
- Find a suitable workplace for your practical training where your supervisor can also read and write English.

Compulsory uniform

You will be required to wear a uniform when you visit your work placement:

- AVT scrub top and name badge (provided)
- Black long pants
- · Sturdy enclosed shoes

Career opportunities and pathways

The great news is that the animal care industry is currently booming as a result of increasing pet ownership and our communities' growing concerns about the welfare of animals. The demand for trained employees and volunteers who have handson skills is on the increase.
