

Work placement

- We recommend completing 100 hours of workplace-based training (work placement) to gain practical skills.
- You are ultimately responsible for finding and securing your work placement position.
- Choose a workplace according to your location, availability, and interests.
- Ideal facilities include kennels, catteries, doggy daycares, shelters, pet shops (with access to animals), wildlife centres, zoos, and vet practices.
- You will need to have access to at least two species of animals.
- Current employment/volunteering in animal care may qualify as a work placement.
- Your work placement will be subject to review and approval.

Working with animals takes patience, compassion, resilience, confidence and the ability to carry out hard work. Does the following sound like you?

- I'm seeking to gain knowledge and skills to increase my opportunities for employment and further study.

Entry requirements

The great news is, there are no prerequisites for this course however you will need to:

- Have a reliable internet connection and laptop.
- Be proficient in speaking and writing in English.
- Be physically capable of restraining animals, handling animal feed e.g. large bags of food of up to 10kg and standing for extended periods of time.
- Have a minimum level of schooling up to and including year 10, with a good understanding of science and maths.
- Be at least Year 10 high school age
- Find a suitable workplace for your practical training where your supervisor can also read and write English.

Compulsory uniform

We want you to look your best, and we also want to make sure you won't be afraid to get a little messy whilst participating in hands-on training.

That's why you will wear a uniform when you visit your work placement:

Career opportunities and pathways
