

Information for VET Coordinators Supporting Secondary Students

Do you have students passionate about animal care?

The following information has been prepared to provide schools and VET Coordinators with the options available for high school students to study at Applied Vocational Training (AVT).

As a dedicated animal care training organisation, AVT offers VET pathway options to high school students to launch a career in the animal care industry.



General information

Provider	AVT is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO 5273) operating within the legal authority of the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011.
Course offered	The ACM20121 Certificate II in Animal Care qualification has been assessed as appropriate for inclusion on the Department of Training and Workforce Development's <u>VET delivered to Secondary Schools funded list 2025</u> .

Fees	a. Limited funded places are available through the Department of Training and Workforce Development for eligible students enrolled in the on-site course*.

The following AVT courses are suitable for secondary school aged students enrolled in compulsory education in Western Australia

VETDSS On-Site Course

ACM20121 Certificate II in Animal Care (VETDSS High School)

This is an on-site course at Landsdale Farm in Darch, WA, best suited to Years 10 – 12 high school aged students who are passionate about a career working with animals.

- Duration: Three terms (view timetable)
- Practical training: 1 day per week at Landsdale Farm in Darch, WA
- **Course work**: Complete online eLearning from home and during classes. Attending all scheduled classroom and practical training sessions is a compulsory requirement for students funded through Jobs and Skills WA
- **Prerequisite**: No prior qualifications are required
- Entry requirements: Complete a supervised Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) quiz
- **Fees**: Limited Jobs and Skills WA VETDSS funded places available*. Full fee for service (\$3,990) places may be available for student who are not eligible for funding.

*Funded places are subject to eligibility and availability. Student tuition fees are indicative only and are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment.

VETDSS Online Course

ACM20121 Certificate II in Animal Care (Online)

Best suited to students who are not Perth-based or are unable to attend oncampus locations for weekly classes and practical training.

- Study mode: Online
- **Duration**: Up to 1 year
- **Start**: Flexible start date to suit you
- **Practical training**: Approx. 100 hours in an Approved Workplace of your choice. Work placements must be arranged by the student/parent/ guardian/school and must be approved as a suitable workplace by AVT
- **Online study time**: Approx. 10-15 hours per week, during school or after hours
- **Prerequisite**: No prior qualifications are required
- Entry requirements: Complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) quiz
- **Fees**: \$2,845**. This is a fee for service course and there is no funding available.

**Fees, inclusions and payment plan amounts are subject to change.







Application and enrolment process

Students/parents/guardians interested in applying for a place on an AVT VETDSS course are encourage to firstly discuss with their VET Coordinator at school After watching the 'What to Expect' video and reading the essential and environment requirements, student to apply for the course via the AVT website

AVT will contact student's VET Coordinator via email outlining

- Student details
- Course applied for
- Course dates/location/times and attendance requirements
 - Supervised LLN requirements

VET Coordinator to respond and input where appropriate and sign acceptance if they are satisfied with the application for the individual student concerned. VET Coordinators are encouraged to contact AVT directly with any queries or concerns

AVT will contact the student/parent/guardian to discuss suitability for course and to answer any questions Students/parents/guardians/ VET Coordinators will be notified of outcome. Offer letters and acceptance procedures will be sent to successful applicants

Upon acceptance, and having gained all appropriate approvals from parents/guardians/schools, the student will be formally enrolled no later than four weeks prior to commencement of the course

VET Coordinators will receive a copy of the Starting Your Course email and the Statement of Enrolment (SOE). These are also sent to the student
